

CIHS Update - Enrollment

% of Enrollment Target Achieved from Grant Inception to June 30, 2012 - All Grantees




Green =100%+. Yellow=70%-99%. Red=below 70%





CIHS Update - Reassessment

% of Reassessment Target Achieved from Grant Inception to June 30, 2012 - All Grantees



Green = 80%+. Yellow=50%-79%. Red=below 50%





Update on RAND Evaluation

Current activities

- Baseline data from Cohorts I III
 - Program and consumer characteristics
- Follow-up data from Cohort I
 - Beginning to look at program and consumer changes over time
 - Outcomes analysis: Difference-in-difference design
 - Data collection complete Spring 2013
- Quality metrics
 - Physical health; Behavioral health; Integration





Quality Metrics

- Help clinical staff monitor quality of care
 - Ensure a role for evaluation/evaluators after the grant ends
- Quality metrics can be calculated from PBHCI data
 - National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA)
 - Institute for Clinical Systems Improvement (ICSI)
 - Physician Consortium for Performance Improvement (PCPI)
 - National Association of State MH Program Directors Research Institute (NASMHPD-NRI)





Quality Metrics - Examples

At risk for Diabetes (NCQA)

- LDL-C <100mg/dL (TRAC)
- BP <130/80 mm Hg (TRAC)

At risk for Hypertension (ICSI)

 % received education on the use of non-pharmacological treatments (TRAC, Registry)

Tobacco users (PCPI)

 Received cessation interventions (w/in 2 yrs) including counseling and/or pharmacotherapy (TRAC, Registry)
