Certified Community Behavioral Health Clinics (CBHCs) have dramatically increased access to mental health and substance use disorder treatment, expanded states' capacity to address the overdose crisis, and established innovative partnerships with law enforcement, schools and hospitals to improve care, reduce recidivism and prevent hospital readmissions. As the pandemic continues to impact the mental health of our communities, we will look at the CCBHC model's comprehensive approach to care, opportunities to support and expand the model across the country, and the critical role of city and county leaders.

- National Council: CCBHC Model, Impact, and Advocacy Opportunities
