How to Submit

To submit an abstract, go to the <u>NatCon23 Submission Site</u> and complete the online form. You may begin the submission process and return to your saved proposal any time prior to the submission deadline. **All proposals must be submitted online.**

Please note that all speakers selected to present at NatCon23 will be required to register for the Conference. Speakers receive a discounted registration rate of \$450 for a full Conference registration.

All applications must be received no later than 11:59 p.m. PT (2:59 a.m. ET). Friday, September 23, 2022.

Session Formats

Proposals are being accepted for the following formats: workshop presentations, Mental Health First Aid Summit presentations, poster presentations, TED-style talks and Ignite presentations, iPoster presentations and the NatCon23 Shark Tank. (You will be asked to specify your desired session format during the submittal process.)

• Workshop Presentations: Workshop presentations last one hour, including Q&A. They are interactive and have a scope beyond individual programs. Workshops focus on emerging trends, creative concepts and new solutions that benefit the field and shape the future. Workshop

presentations may have one presenter, multiple presenters or can be formulated as a panel. No more than three panelists and one moderator are permitted.

- Mental Health First Aid Summit Presentations: Structured like workshops, presentations during the Mental Health First Aid Summit are intended for an audience of Mental Health First Aid Instructors. They can focus on cultural awareness, funding your initiative, inspiring with stories from peers and public figures or helping reach new audiences in your community.
- TED-style Talk and Ignite Sessions: TED-style Talks are short, powerful talks on riveting topics lasting just 18 minutes or less. Ignite sessions are exactly five minutes with 20 auto-advancing, highly visual slides, allowing presenters to share their passions in riveting, moving and memorable ways. Think beyond both your work and beyond our field to creative stories that will excite and inspire audiences. Outside the box is what we are looking for.
- Poster Presentations: Posters presentations are interactive electronic poster displays of
 innovative practices and award-winning programs that can include the latest in research and
 data. These electronic posters are available to be viewed by attendees on screens throughout the
 Conference. Up to two authors are scheduled at a designated time to present their information
 and answer questions about their poster for 30 minutes on Monday or Tuesday.

Selection Criteria

NatCon23 seeks educational sessions that highlight concepts that are **practical**, **replicable and relevant** for attendees.

The process is very selective. If a proposal warrants a general session or thought leader session, instead of a workshop, the National Council will make that determination and inform the submitter.

The National Council will use the following criteria to select presentations:

- **Originality:** NatCon includes only unique and exciting content that reflects our dynamic community.
- Relevance and Replicability: Presentations must be of great interest to attendees, clearly benefit attendees' professional needs and are replicable in other treatment organizations.
- **Presentation Design:** Presentations must incorporate good practices for adult education, with clear learning objectives that are measurable and achievable.
- Outcomes: All presentations must demonstrate strong outcomes.
- **Ability to Inspire Action:** Content experts who present at NatCon inspire attendees to return to their organizations and implement what they learn.
- Overall Quality: NatCon learning opportunities meet the highest standards of excellence.

All proposals must be complete, comprehensive, and deemed relevant and timely to the conference's audience. The National Council may shorten a presentation, increase and/or reduce the number of presenters, select alternate presenters from among those proposed and/or combine the submitted presentation with other proposed presentations, at its sole discretion. All presenters will be contacted independently to confirm their submittal.

To support our organizational commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion, we are committed to creating Conference programming that reflects the diversity of our membership organizations and the communities they serve. Please consider including a diverse set of speakers when submitting panels as part of your proposal.

Notifications

Once you have submitted your proposal, you can expect:



- 1. Acknowledgement: Upon receipt of your submission, you will receive an email acknowledgement.
- 2. **Notification**: You will be notified about the status of your presentation by December 15, 2022.
- 3. **Follow-up**: If selected to present, the National Council will contact you to discuss each presentation in detail, bringing together both presenters and moderators and will help presenters determine AV needs and manage presentation materials.
 - a. **Presenters:** All accepted presenters will get information on how to access the Speaker Resource Center (SRC). Presenters will receive a discounted registration rate of \$450 for a full registration or may register for their presentation only at no cost. All speakers are required to register for the Conference and are required to log into the SRC to confirm participation in the conference, provide a presentation description, three measurable learning objectives, references and a few additional items by the given due dates.
 - b. iPoster Presenters: All accepted iPoster presenters will receive a \$100 discount on Conference registration (all poster presenters are required to register for the Conference) and information on how to log into the NatCon iPoster system to build the digital poster. All presenters will be assigned a 30-minute presentation time during the conference to engage in an informal presentation and Q&A session with attendees.

Reminder: All presentations must be educational in nature and may not be used to market products or services.

Note: The submitting author must provide a valid e-mail address as the National Council will rely exclusively on e-mail communications related to abstract submission, disposition, and presentation. It is the responsibility of the submitting author to contact National Council in the event of failure to receive e-mail communication and to relay all correspondence about the abstract(s) to all co-author(s).
